Enforcement – Milverton Rd is currently subject to an appeal and Wellisford has received an application for certificate of lawfulness.

Barbed wire at Crown Field – Glen Martin (footpaths officer) has said due to the width of the path the barbed wire poses no problem.

Wall opposite Church – This has now been repaired and due to time scale there was no chance for Street works in County Hall to inform the public of the recent road closure.

10. Correspondence
