# ANNUAL NEWSLETTER 2014/15



Dear friends and parishioners,

I'm writing this at a very exciting time for St Peter's as the PCC (Parochial Church Council) are working hard to plan the reordering of the Church. But more of that later, first of all I would like thank you for supporting us in a variety of ways over the past year.

As you know, The Friends was formed to raise money to conserve and improve our historic Church so we are very grateful to those of you who have pledged money either by standing order, or a one-off donation. Donations that have been gift-added are additionally valuable as this increases the amount by a substantial 25%.

We're always looking for new Friends - you can join us for as little as £1.00 a month - and if you are already involved please stay with us and encourage others with a connection to the village to become a Friend as well.

We also raise money through a number of fundraising events throughout the year and the income from these, together with our donations, has brought the Friends bank balance to a healthy £4,741.91. This is a valuable sum but we need to raise a lot more because...

...over the next couple of years the Church is going to see some impressive changes of value to the whole community. I mentioned as the beginning of my letter the reordering of St Peters, which sounds a bit unnerving but isn't, other than to the members of the PCC who are going to have to do all the preliminary work. Quite simply, a couple of areas inside the Church are going to be modified to make it a *more* people friendly place. Of course it is already, but not if you or your child are desperate to spend a penny, or you want to gather together with your friends at a social gathering.

The initial ideas are twofold:

- ❖ To install a loo and greatly improve the kitchen area at the base of the tower. This is no mean feat as there isn't any plumbing in the church!
- To remove the pews from the Bindon Aisle and replace them with chairs so the area can be easily used by the community and the children at the school. Again, no easy matter as the floor will need to be raised and a multitude of other problems overcome.

The results will be of great benefit to all in the village but it will be very expensive. Grants are available but funds raised by the Friends will play an important part in making this all happen. We really need your help.
